Music has the power to inspire, motivate, and transcend. Learning to play an instrument builds creativity, self-confidence, and problem-solving skills while fostering teamwork and lifelong friendships—benefits that go far beyond gaining the ability to create beautiful music.

For nearly 60 years, **Wisconsin Youth Symphony Orchestras (WYSO)** has given children across ethnicities, races, and socioeconomic backgrounds access to the transformative power of being a musician. Our 5000+ alumni have gone on to lead successful, productive adult lives, shaped in part by the discipline, creativity, and camaraderie instilled by their WYSO experience.

Funding a new home for music education

Over the decades, WYSO students lacked a dedicated place to rehearse and perform. Thanks to committed community partners we had access to borrowed spaces—schools, churches, and even parking lots. But we longed for a permanent home to use and share.

In 2021, WYSO launched the **Note by Note Campaign** to fund the new WYSO Center for Music. Thanks to our generous supporters, we raised \$28 million—a fantastic accomplishment. However, rising construction costs pushed the final price to \$33 million, requiring us to take out a loan to complete the project. To fully fund our new home and secure WYSO's future, we must raise \$5 million to retire this debt and sustain our programs.
